0. Ratification of the minutes of the meeting held on 27th April 2025

Minutes of the meeting held on 27th April 2025 were ratified unanimously.

1. Routine Staff Matters Loans

Grant of Loans to 3 Teachers in Sangamam of Rs 60,000 each were approved as per laid down norms. Out of these one was a personal loan to deal with her husband's heavy medical expenses. Grant of a loan to a teacher in Thulasi of Rs 60,000 was also approved. Another grant of a personal loan was approved at the request of a staff member in Cauvery. Conditions apply. The project stewards, it was reminded, would be co-guarantors.

2. Donations update: KLA, Amazon, Code.org, Poshvine, others.

It was unfortunate that the request for proposals under CSR from KLA , famous for its packaging semiconductor products came to our notice rather late. It appeared that the causes for which they donated CSR funds seemed to correspond to our activities.

Rajaraman informed the meeting the following.

- Funds to the tune of Rs 2,10,00,000 were received from Amazon.
- Code.org has informed that they would arrange for the funding of the amount required for running the CSF programming course as part of ACE.
 Modalities were still being worked out since it involved some tax complications.

- O Poshmark has donated Rs 5,00,000.
- Asha St Louis has promised USD 40,000 this year and probably a lower amount from next year to be used for supporting Poorna Vidhya which should also include Olcott Memorial School in Besant Nagar Chennai.

Rajaraman felt that ASHA Chennai should get an active and robust CRM (Customer Relationship Management) system to track CSR Companies and follow up vigorously. Venkat was requested to examine the suggestion.

3. Presentation of Budget Proposals by Project Stewards and their approval*

(Note the Approved Budget Figures- other those schools covered by Amazon Budget, are given in the table at the end of this agenda item.)

- Asha Kanini Rajaraman presented the Budget for 25-26 highlighting the salient points, drawing attention to the fact that Damaka which was sharing Mylapore Office accommodation had completely vacated. So, the total rent of Rs 40,000 should be shared as follows Asha Kanini Rs 20,000, Admin Rs 8000, Sangamam Rs 4000, Poorna Vidhya Rs 4000 and Scholarship Rs 4000. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 34,00,000.
- Cauvery Komalavalli presented the Budget figures for 25-26. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 18,83,400. Independent of this budget we will also be establishing an RTC at Kottur.
- Manigal Usha Bhaskar presented the figures for Manigal Project which is sui generis among other Asha projects in that it helps education of the nomadic Narikuravar community. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 10,24,000.
- Mirzapur (Presented on 27th June) Sujatha made her presentation of the Budget of Mirzapur. After some discussions on possible expanding outreach to new schools, albeit in small steps, it was decided to split the budget into two parts, one for sustaining the existing school coverage and another for potential expansion. Budget 25-26 approved for Rs 10,10,420.
- Pearl Bhaskar initiated the discussions on his budget for schools Some suggestions were made regarding some specific line items which were duly incorporated. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 47,82,650
- Poorna Vidhya Sriram presented his budget in two parts, one for existing schools and other for a small expansion. His budget also took into account supporting Olcott Memorial as Asha St Louis had promised a targeted donation for that school. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 33,28,000.
- Rajatalab Sriram proposed 2 additional teachers in the budget proposal he presented. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 30,99,800. Note that this is partly funded by Asha Austin.
- Sangamam (Presented on 24th June) Rajaraman explained the details of the computations of this flagship biggest project and the budget was duly approved. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 1,19,05,000
- Scholarship (Presented on 27th June) Kalyan stated that he proposed an induction of 30 new scholars (40% at HS and HSS Level and 60% College level). Kalyan stated that he had retained the provision for career counselling for Asha scholars. Rajaraman suggested that we should revive our contact with Mr. Nedunchezhian who is a good counsellor and runs an organisation called TICF (The India College finder). The budget based on the above was approved. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs 37,68,000.
- -Tulasi (Presented on 24th June) Paripoornam gave the details of working of her budget both for schools and the Library. This includes purchase of Karadi Path Kits. On the support for Libraries she said that Asha Boston had not yet replied to her query. Budget was approved. Budget for 25-26 approved for Rs
- 4.347.620 for the School Portion and 3.46.600, for the Libraries.

- 4. Status of Activities Related to the government.
- NSNOP Approval It was gratifying to note that Asha Chennai, thanks to the efforts of our volunteer Murali, got approvals for all our programs for two years in all the schools.
- Spark Program Although there was a buzz about teaching CS from classes 6 to 9 created by Tamil Nadu Education authorities and Samagraha Sikhsha Abhiyan, none of the schools or even officials at the district levels were aware of the launch of this program.
- ADW Hostels bid. Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar and Tribal welfare department had floated public tenders to prospective agencies to undertake computer training of students in ADW Hostels. Accordingly, Asha Chennai had made a proposal to teach computer science in 82 Hostels covering 4571 students. This involved hiring 60 teachers. It would cover Thiruvannamalai, Villupuram and Thiruvallur Districts. Asha Chennai has submitted its bid based on a budg et for Rs 97 Lakhs.
- 5. Annual Teacher Assessment and parameters for pay review.

Details were discussed about the differentials between lead teacher, CS Trainers etc. While we have a fairly gradual increase in salary from lower to higher levels, other organizations tend to have a more skewed salary structure which places a risk on us losing some of our best teachers. We will continue monitoring this situation.

Teacher evaluation test would be held on 28th June with each teacher taking either Maths-English-Science Test or the CS Paper depending on their role. Opportunity would be given to RTC students to take the MES test.

Venkat suggested a Pay Award of Rs 10,000 could be granted to those Lead Teachers and RTC Teachers (about 10 in Number) who had worked hard sacrificing their personal time to do the training for other teachers during the last one year. This was unanimously approved.
